

E-Mobility Europe Elects New Presidency Team to Lead Europe's Electric Mobility Ecosystem

Brussels, 30 June 2026 – E-Mobility Europe has appointed Francesca Gamboni, Chief Industrial Operations Officer of Volvo Cars, as President for Passenger Vehicles, and Anja van Niersen, Chief Executive Officer of Milence, as President for Trucks & Logistics.

Together, they will lead the voice of Europe's electric mobility industry at a pivotal moment for the continent's transport transition. Bringing together companies and associations from across the electric vehicle, charging, battery, energy and technology sectors, they will help shape the policies needed to accelerate electrification while strengthening Europe's industrial competitiveness and energy resilience.

Their 2026–2028 mandate begins at a decisive moment. Electric vehicle sales are growing rapidly again, but Europe now needs to turn that momentum into mass-market adoption. That means making electric vehicles more affordable, expanding charging infrastructure, strengthening European manufacturing and ensuring policy gives businesses the confidence to keep investing.

Over the next two years, E-Mobility Europe will play a leading role in shaping the EU policy agenda for transport electrification. The association will actively engage in key legislative files, including the EU's automotive package for cars and vans, the reviews of the heavy-duty vehicle CO₂ standards, the Alternative Fuels Infrastructure Regulation, alongside wider initiatives on electricity markets, grids, industrial policy and clean technology investment. Across these discussions, E-mobility Europe will champion policies that speed up electric vehicle deployment while reinforcing Europe's industrial base, energy security and long-term competitiveness.

Francesca Gamboni, President for Passenger Vehicles, E-Mobility Europe, said:

“As President for Passenger Vehicles at E-Mobility Europe, I look forward to working with industry and policymakers to ensure Europe provides the predictable regulatory framework and practical enablers needed for a successful transition to electric mobility. We will work towards ensuring policymakers treat electrification as an irreversible path. It is key industrial strategy, not just transport policy.”

Anja van Niersen, President for Trucks & Logistics, E-Mobility Europe, said:

“Europe is at a turning point. As it looks to strengthen its energy resilience, road freight has a critical role to play. Electrifying this crucial sector is no longer just about reducing emissions but more and more about competitiveness and energy security. The technology is ready, charging infrastructure is expanding rapidly, demand is growing, and the business case is becoming increasingly attractive. Our task now is to create the right conditions to accelerate deployment at scale. I look forward to bringing the voice of the heavy-duty ecosystem to the table, working with stakeholders across the value chain, and helping make Europe a leader in electric freight.”

The General Assembly also confirmed E-Mobility Europe's Board for the 2026–2028 mandate, bringing together fifteen senior leaders from across Europe's electric mobility ecosystem. The Board reflects

the full value chain - from vehicle manufacturers and charging companies to battery, energy, software and mobility providers - ensuring the association continues to speak with a united industry voice.
